Shape Collection # 2 was published in August 2006. There are instructions for printing on fabric, but there are expanded instructions in Chapter 1 of *THE INKLINGO HANDBOOK*, which is a free download from [www.inklingo.com](http://www.inklingo.com). Other improvements are listed on the last page of this PDF.

Choose any Inklingo collection based on the shapes you need.

As of September 2008, new collections are being published in downloadable format. Inklingo Shape Collection # 2 will only be available while supplies last, but the same shapes will be included in future downloadable collections.

*inklingo* **STITCH & CUT** method is perfect for machine piecing triangles into squares.\*



# stitch & cut

Paper guides for triangles became popular because they provide stitching and cutting lines, and allow the stitching to be done before the bias seams are cut, improving accuracy. However, removing the paper is a time-consuming extra step and can distort the seams.

Inklingo gives us precise stitching and cutting guides on the fabric itself. Of course, if you want to print Inklingo triangles on paper, you can, but I don't think you will want to when you have stitched the Inklingo way.

One fabric is printed to guide the stitching and cutting, and without measuring. Just choose the finished size (without seam allowances).

**STITCH & CUT** has all the advantages of paper stitching guides, with none of the disadvantages, and without templates or special tools. It is perfect for Sawtooth and Hourglass squares.

To stitch a dozen or more triangles, just print one sheet of fabric, layer it with unprinted fabric, stitch on the diagonal lines, and cut.

## TIPS

- **PINNING** If you have a walking foot, you probably do not need to pin. Pressing the two layers together will reduce shifting, but if you need to, baste along one or more cutting lines instead of pinning. The basting will automatically be removed when you cut the shapes apart.

- **PLANNING** Plan your route for HST and QST to stitch continuously (using the needle-down feature, if available), pivoting at the seam endings, as shown by the arrow above.

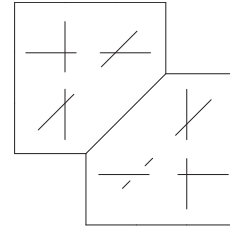

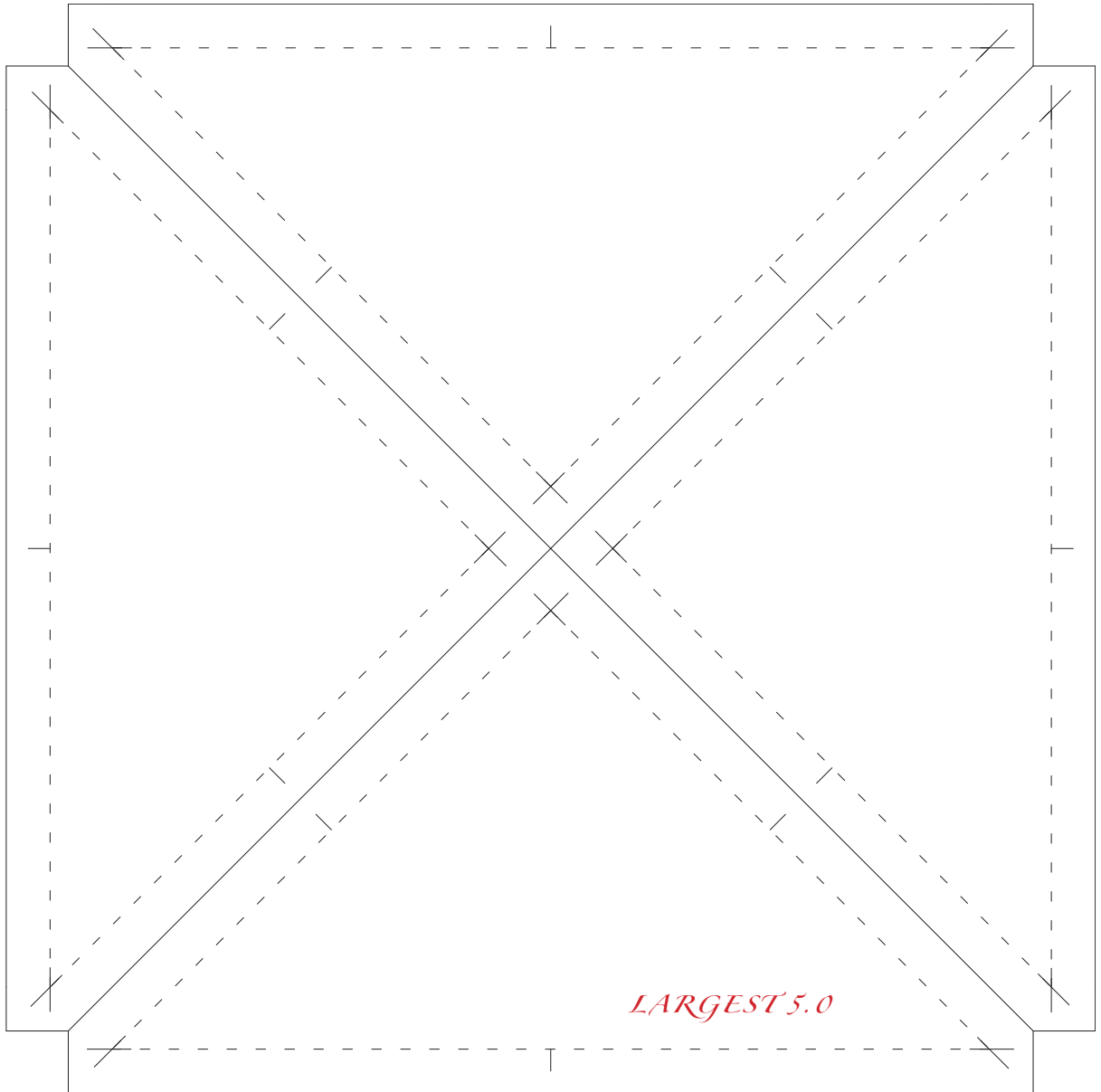

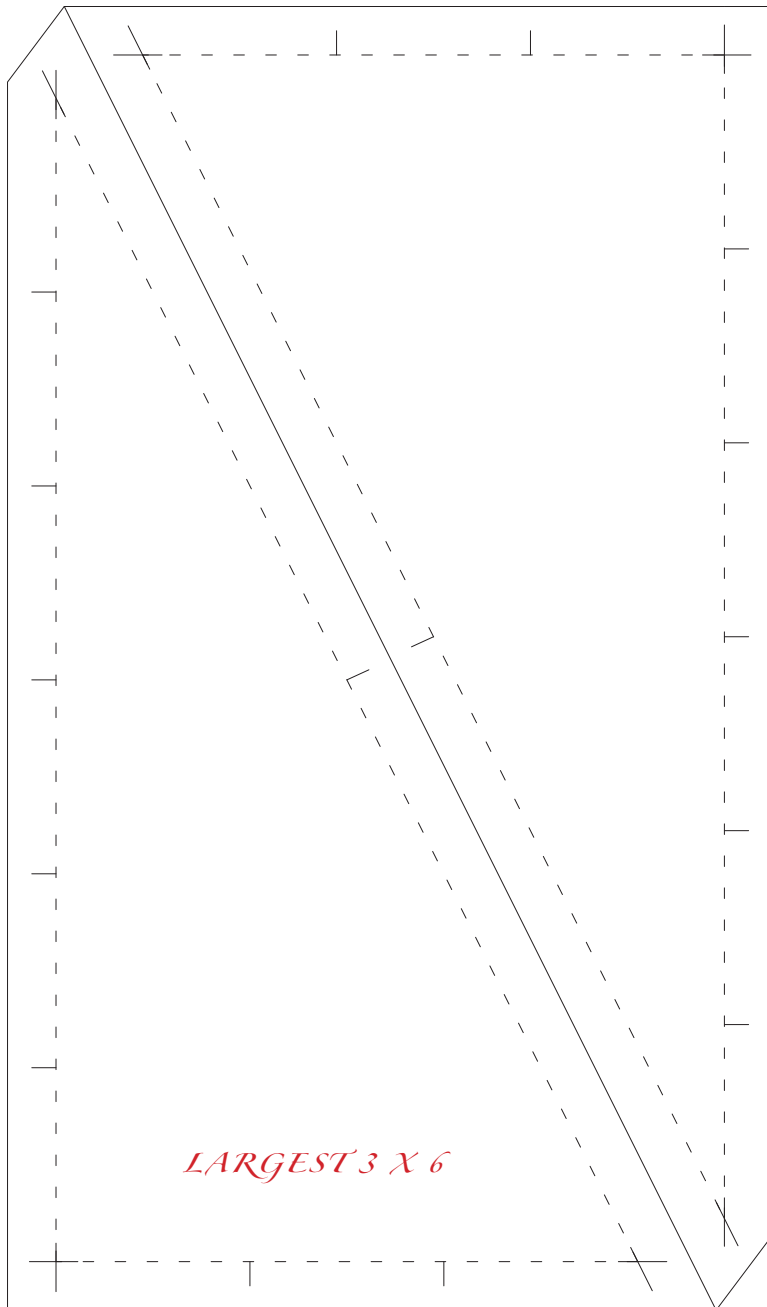

## *OTHER IMPROVEMENTS*

Inklingo # 1 and # 2 will continue to be available while supplies last. When they are gone, the shapes will be available in new downloadable collections with some improvements:

- suggested custom page sizes and yardage calculations for every shape\*
- diamonds and triangles will have alternate layouts  
(different grain, orientation in squares or rows, etc)
- rulers on only two edges of each template
- smaller page numbers
- more matching marks
- precision corners (no dog ears, easier matching)
- more shapes have variation with no seam allowance
- **compatible with Mac**
